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Principal's Report

The end of Term 1 is creeping up on us. Despite many student and staff absences, learning has been prioritised and we are constantly trying to find better ways to ensure that school improvement is at the forefront of everyone's focus every day. Students in Years 4 and 6 are currently undertaking Check In assessments provided by the Department of Education to give us valuable information about where our students are at in their learning now, also enabling us to get some level of comparison between our school and other schools in NSW.

COVID Update

We are continuing to get several cases of COVID-19 throughout the school. It appears that some families are unaware of the self-isolation requirements for household contacts. The following information is provided by the Department of Education, in line with NSW Health and public health orders.

Reminder for those who are close or household contacts

If a person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, they must self-isolate away from everyone else in the house for 7 days from the date of their positive test. They must follow the advice for people testing positive to COVID-19 which includes, how to self-isolate effectively. If the person is unable to safely self-isolate by themselves (e.g. due to their young age), a parent or carer should self-isolate with them.

The entire household must also self-isolate for 7 days from the date of the positive person's test. They should follow the advice for people exposed to COVID-19 and take a test as soon as possible, have another test on Day 6 and at any time COVID-19 symptoms appear.

If another person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, that person must restart their 7 day self-isolation period from the date of their positive test, even if they don't have any symptoms.

Other household members who test negative, do not need to re-start their 7 day self-isolation period. They also do not have to self-isolate again anytime in the following 14 days unless they test positive.

People who test positive to COVID-19 and complete their 7-day self-isolation period do not have to test or self-isolate as any type of contact for 12 weeks after their release.

Self-isolation means staying at home or at your accommodation. This means you cannot drive your children to school or day care; you must ask someone else to do this. You must only leave self-isolation to get medical care or in an emergency. For more information, read the self-isolation rules.

We are still waiting on the delivery of more Rapid Antigen Tests to provide to students in Years 3-6.

Principal's Report

If your child registers a positive RAT:

Registering your RAT result and notify the school
If a student or staff member receives a positive RAT result, they need to:

- record the positive RAT result through the <u>Service NSW websiteExternal</u> link or <u>Service NSW</u> appExternal link
- notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR result as soon as possible
- follow <u>NSW Health adviceExternal</u> link to isolate for 7 days.

Registering a positive RAT with Service NSW is a requirement of the Public Health Order and helps NSW Health track COVID-19 in schools and address any public health issues early on if required. More info: https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/.../register-positive...

When can I leave self-isolation?

You must self-isolate for 7 days from the day you were tested. You can only leave self-isolation after 7 days if you do not have a sore throat, runny nose, cough or shortness of breath.

If you had a PCR test or you have registered your positive rapid antigen test, you will receive an SMS from NSW Health, but you do not have to wait for this SMS to leave self-isolation if it has been 7 days since you were tested. For example, if you were tested at 10am on Tuesday, you can leave isolation at 10am on the following Tuesday if you do not have any of these symptoms. You do not need to test before leaving self-isolation in NSW.

Wear a mask when near to or talking to other people and avoid visiting high risk settings (health care, aged care, disability care or correctional facilities) for a further 3 days. If you work in one of these settings speak to your employer before returning. If you have a severely weakened immune system (such as you are a transplant recipient or are receiving chemotherapy) you should take these additional precautions for a further 4 days (a total of 7 days following release from isolation).

When your child returns to school after COVID please actively encourage him/her to wear a mask whilst at school for at least three days.

Kind is the New Cool

We are currently talking to all students about kindness in their play. It is very easy when children are playing games such handball, basketball, soccer etc for competitiveness to take over. Teachers on playground duty are constantly reminding children to treat their friends/opponents in games with empathy and kindness. It is always important for a child to learn to let go of 'winning' sometimes and take another's opinion into consideration with good grace. It leads to a much calmer playground and helps to build a positive school culture.

Easter Hat Parade

The Easter Hat Parade will be held on the last day of this term, Friday 8 April. We are planning to invite parents of students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 to watch the parade. Our P and C is organising an Easter Egg raffle which will be drawn at the Easter Hat Parade. See the flyer in the newsletter to purchase tickets.

Term Break

Friday 8 April is the last day of Term 1. Students return to school on Wednesday 27 April. I wish our students and families a safe and restful break.
