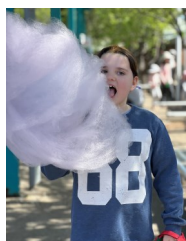

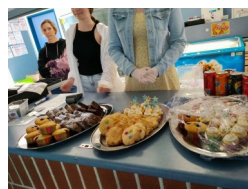
Principal Report

Principal Report

NAPLAN Results

All parents of students in Years 3 and 5 who sat for the NAPLAN assessments in Term 2 should have by now received the results. NAPLAN assessments give us information about where students were sitting in relation to literacy and numeracy outcomes, and their grade related peers at the time of testing. Teachers spend time analysing NAPLAN results, comparing them to school based assessments to assist in future planning and programming. The Department of Education uses NAPLAN results to judge school improvement. Every school is set improvement targets, an increase in students achieving in the top 2 bands in reading and numeracy, and an increase in the number of students achieving expected growth. Expected growth is measured between Year 3 and Year 5, but no NAPLAN in 2020 means that our Year 5 students have no previous data to measure against.

I am extremely pleased with our overall NAPLAN results. We achieved our reading target, with almost 66% of Year 3 and Year 5 students achieving top 2 bands in reading. Although our numeracy target has not been met (51% of students in top 2 bands, with school achievement being 46%), there has been some progress and we will continue to improve student results in this area.

I wish all of our families a safe and happy break from school. School returns on Monday 10 October. Please note that there is no School Development Day (teacher only) at the beginning of Term 4 and that students come back to school on the Monday.

Lunch orders are as normal via flexischool. The canteen will close after lunch orders have been collected. No counter sales for lunch on this day.



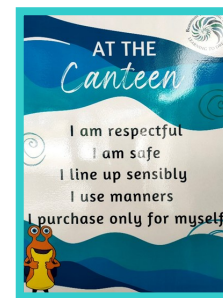
Canteen Line-Up

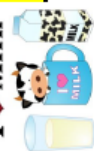
