Deputy Principal Report

What a year 2018 has been! In our final newsletter of the year I celebrate all that our teachers, parents and most importantly our students have achieved. Our school is certainly a busy place and we pride ourself on the provision of a wholistic educational experiences for our students and aim to create a sense of community and connectedness with our families. Below is just a brief look back over some of what we achieved in 2018.

Teaching and Learning

This year our students engaged lessons across the 6 Key Learning Areas - English, Mathematics, Science, Human Society and Its Environment, Creative Arts and Personal Development, Health and Physical Education. Teachers began preparing for the implementation of the new Science K-6 syllabus which will be the syllabus in use from 2019. Units across the school ranged from artist studies, animals, Harry Potter, weather, democracy, mathematical thinking, screen printing, literature studies on picture books and novels, and the list goes on. This learning was supported by many excursions. Our students visited the farm, Tree Tops Adventure, Riverside Theatre, Turkeys Nest, Great Aussie Bush Camp to help support this learning and to bring their new found knowledge to life.

Extra Curricular Activities

Our dedicated staff and supportive parents create so many opportunities for students to grow and develop beyond their academic world. Our staff's enthusiasm and skills in so many areas has allowed a large percentage of our students to be involved in creative, sporting and interest based endeavours outside of the classroom. Our jam packed calendar certainly keeps staff, students and parents on their toes and it seems not a week goes by without a PSSA game, a performance night, a veggie sale under the COLA or a chess competition in the hall. It is the provision of so many activities that allow our student body to feel a sense of achievement and pride and allow other students to aspire and explore skills and talents in areas never before contemplated. As these activities come to an end all those involved should be proud of the respectful and admirable way they have represented the school and engaged in the activities provided to them. We look forward to 2019 and another year of dance, sports and interest based activities.

Social and Emotional Programs

At Beaumont Hills PS we are acutely aware that a child's progress benefits from a sense of connectedness and feeling of overall wellbeing. For this reason we have established many programs that allow students to thrive as they develop social and leadership skills and a resilient nature that prepares them for our ever changing world. Programs such as Peer Play, Peer Tutoring, Rock and Water and Boy's Shed work alongside our teaching and learning programs to achieve a sense of overall wellbeing for our students. In addition to these groups we also provide whole school events and programs that allow our students to develop an awareness of those around them and societal issues and perspectives. Our Peer Support and Friendly Schools Plus units fall under this category. This year our students once again focused on an anti bullying message in our Bullying No Way! Week. A sense of belonging and understanding of cultures was achieved through our Harmony Day and NAIDOC week activities and celebrations.

Leadership Opportunities

While perhaps the most visible of our leadership opportunities for our students is the School Leadership Team and House Captains there are many more initiatives in place within our school which provide students with the chance to exhibit their compassion, organisation and school pride. On any given day within our school we have the Peer Play Program and Peer Tutoring running. Our Library monitors are hard at work with Mrs Flanagan and Mrs Thwaites ensure our library is an organised and friendly place for our students. Our buddy program allows all Year 6 students to support and guide our Kindy students as they learn about school. The Rock and Water program is another avenue for leadership skills and our Stage 3 students have worked alongside our Stage 2 students throughout the year on projects which they celebrate with pride.

School and Community Engagement Opportunities

A strong partnership between home and school has unlimited positive benefits on creating a successful school. There have been many successful events throughout the year for our parent community to engage in and enjoy. The pinnacle of our year in terms of school celebration was once again our Education Week program, particularly Open Day. This combined with Grandparent's Concert, Band Demo, Meet The Teacher Evenings, Parent / Teacher interviews, Learning and Support Meetings and the BEAU Awards provides many opportunities for the students to see parents and staff working together with the same goal in mind. These school based events are complemented by the amazing work done by our P&C committee who host our Welcome Back to School event, discos and Working Bees just to name a few. We truly appreciate the positive feedback and supportive interactions between home and school and look forward to another successful year in 2019.
